Abstract

Recent critical gerontology has drawn attention to the origins, functions and consequences for elders of the â€~successful aging' discourse. In this paper we describe parallels between successful aging and what we are calling â€~spunky survivorship,' the contemporary subject position made available to women in the years after a breast cancer diagnosis. The central focus of the paper is a study about the intersections between a dominant discourse of breast cancer survivorship, and the perceptions and experiences of women living the years beyond breast cancer.
