The one hundred and seventeenth Annual General Meeting was held at the Trades Union Congress Library Collections, London Metropolitan University, London, on Tuesday, 20th October 2009. The President, Professor John Barnard, was in the Chair. The minutes of the previous AGM (which had been

printed in *The Library* for June 2009) were taken as read, seconded by Dr Colin Tite, and confirmed.

Speaking to the Annual Report, the President noted that 36 new members were elected in the past year, bringing the number of members to 908, and he read the names of members who had died since the last AGM. He reported that Bill Bell had become Editor of *The Library* and was maintaining the journal's high standards. Other items noted were: the electronic version of *The Library* was enabling greater access to scholars; the regular lecture programme was...
