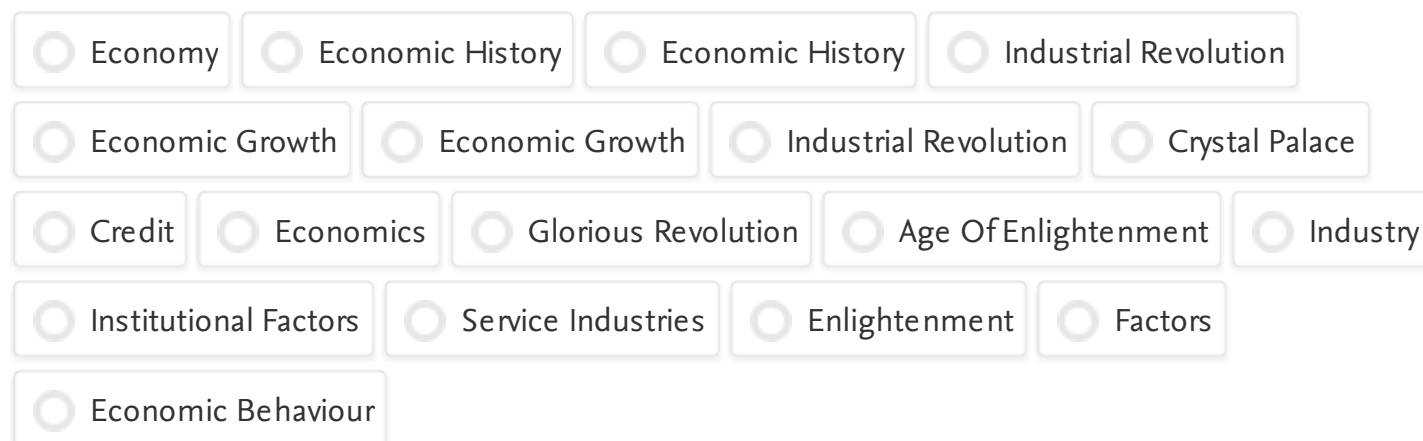
Abstract

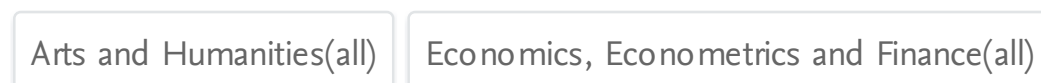
