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Mimicry, Spatial Captation, and Feng Shui in Han Ong's Fixer Chao

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Abstract

Han Ong's *Fixer Chao* revises our understanding of ethnic and cultural mimicry by representing two versions of Feng Shui. On the one hand, the gay Filipino protagonist poses as a Feng Shui master in order to cheat and undermine his rich Manhattanite class enemies. Nevertheless, the environmental alterations he enacts have material and social consequences, and indicate the need for rethinking mimicry not only as a mode of subversion, but also in terms of spatial practices, affective loyalties, and geographical flows.

In a wide-ranging and suggestive essay entitled "Cubism, Camouflage, Silence, Democracy: A Phenomenological Approach," cultural historian Stephen Kern argues that the decomposition of formal distinctions between subject and background in Cubist paintings and military camouflage was an inherently democratic phenomenon. By effectively filling up all "negative space" on their canvases, "The cubists wiped out . . . hierarchy in their paintings and thus 'democratized' the picture surface" (169). Kern's analysis suggests that experimental painters and poets whose work is often viewed as inaccessible and elite were in fact profoundly democratic in form. Instead of focusing on beautiful or desirable objects, these artists taught their audiences to view objects as inseparable from their surroundings, composed by (or rather with) aspects of light, silence, atmosphere, and environment that can no longer be viewed negatively as mere background.
