Abstract : Sixteen chapters are presented which emphasize sports and sport behaviours as they occur in social and cultural contexts. The sixth edition of the book had most sections rewritten, adding updated material to all chapters, and reorganizing chapters in response to new research findings and new theoretical developments in the field. Over 500 new references are cited in this edition. A new chapter has been introduced on socialization issues in sport. The chapters cover: conceptualizing the sociology of sports; how social theories can be used to inform researchers of sport in society; ways in which sports have changed throughout history;

socialization; organized sports programmes for children; whether deviance getting out of control; whether sports act as a control or tend to encourage behaviour in society; whether equity is the only issue in women's access to whether skin colour and cultural heritage are important in sport participation; social and economic inequality matters in sports; defining the characteristics of sports; the symbiotic relationship between sports and the media; sports, politics and state; the educational value of sports in high school and college; the relationship between sports and religion; and sports in the future.
