Sir James Reckitt, a Quaker, Chairman of Reckitt & Sons, Limited, a manufacturer of laundry and household Kingston upon Hull, was well known as a local philanthropist. Philanthropy, perhaps combined with fear of social firm foundation of his own experience in public life, provided the impetus for Sir James Reckitt to build Hull Ga commencing in 1907. A range of house sizes was rented to the workforce and others, within walking distance of Local architects Runton & Barry supervised all aspects of the building and village layout. Hull Garden Village was built largely as the vision of one man, with significant input from fami personal financial resources gained as a major employer in a large port.
