Abstract

A Listening Wind, a collection of translated original texts and edited by Marcia Haag, highlights the large array of Indigenous linguistic and literary traditions of the U.S. Southeast. A whole range of genres and selected texts represent the Choctaw, Creek, Chickasaw, Yuchi, Cherokee, Koasati, and Atakapa.

The traditional and modern Native literature genres showcased include stories that speakers perceive to be in the past (or “fixated” developed alongside these stories, and modern story types that have supplanted traditional tales and are now enjoying trajectories that have been selected to demonstrate particular literary themes
