Garrison Keillor, in his Lake Wobegon stories, has created an image of Lutheran culture in the upper Midwest that endears most of the country to these Scandinavians, who, much like J. R. R. Tolkien's hobbits, spend their time discussing food—Jello salads and tuna casseroles—gossiping about their family and friends, and living smug lives of confidence and comfort based on their faith in the moral fabric of the universe, their own above-average performance, and their isolation from situations and worldviews that can seriously challenge that faith.
