

FORMED BY STORY: THE

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Abstract:

In contrast to the common interpretive practice of using biblical narratives as sources from which to derive general principles about Christian living, this paper argues the narrative of Scripture as a whole constitutes the doctrine by which Christians are to live. This perspective influences all aspects of salvation: justification (past) means claiming a new identity; sanctification (present) means becoming an actor in that story; and glorification (future) means experiencing the final conclusion of the story.
