The Honor Flight Network is a national non-profit organization that "transport our heroes to Washington D.C. to visit the White House and the Lincoln Memorial." Wamego High School pairs high school students from the Wamego area with veterans. This experiential service-learning project allows students to connect with and learn from America's "G.I. Generation." Veterans of the Vietnam War are accompanied by student-guardians who provide support and assistance. The trip is accomplished with students first and foremost providing a service to the veterans. Yet, the promise of the journey is realized when students see the world through the eyes of those who exemplified courage, fortitude, and respect for the principles of civic virtue. Similarly, the veterans see the world through the eyes of those who provided respectful service; virtuous acts voluntary, not obligatory. The trip is a journey of discovery for those who actively preserved the republican experiment and experienced hope for the future as well as gratitude for the sacrifices of those who served.

This report includes a narrative of the inaugural mission.
