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Abstract

The centrality of the Eucharist to the Church cannot be underestimated in the late 20th and early 21st centuries, decreased frequency of shared meals, increased reliance on fast food, and a disregard for the obligations and responsibilities that the Eucharist entails have resulted in a disconnection between the Eucharist and daily life. This thesis demonstrates the loci method derived from Philip Melancthon's *Loci Communes* for gathering scripture and non-scriptural sources around loci. The thesis is titled *Siena: Table, Food, and Waiter*. The aim of this thesis is that it will be used in preparing sermons that address today's popular food culture.

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
